

Mass Propers for April 13, Palm Sunday

Introit: O Lord, be not far from me; O my help, hasten to aid me. Save me from the lion's mouth; from the horns of the wild bulls, my wretched life. My God, my God, look upon me, why have You forsaken me? Far from my salvation are the words of my sins.

Collect: Almighty, eternal God, Who, to provide mankind an example of humility for it to imitate, willed that the Saviour should assume our flesh and suffer death upon the Cross, mercifully grant that we may be found worthy of the lesson of His endurance and the fellowship of His resurrection.

Lesson: (Phil 2:5-11) Brethren: Have this in mind in you which was also in Christ Jesus, Who, though He was by nature God, did not consider being equal to God a thing to be clung to, but emptied Himself, taking the nature of a slave and being made like unto men. And appearing in the form of man, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to death, even to death on a cross. Therefore God also has exalted Him and has bestowed upon Him the Name that is above every name, Kneel so that at the Name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth and under the earth and every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God the Father.

Gradual and Tract: You have hold of my right hand; with Your counsel You guide me; and in the end You will receive me in glory. How good God is to Israel, to those who are clean of heart! But, as for me, I almost lost my balance; my feet all but slipped, because I was envious of sinners when I saw them prosper though they were wicked. My God, my God, look upon me: why have You forsaken me?

- Far from my salvation, are the words of my sins.
- O my God, I cry out by day, and You answer not; by night, and there is no relief.
- But You are enthroned in the holy place, O glory of Israel!
- In You our fathers trusted; they trusted and You delivered them.
- To You they cried, and they escaped; in You they trusted, and they were not put to shame.
- But I am a worm, not a man; the scorn of men, despised by the people.
- All who see me, scoff at me; they mock me with parted lips, they wag their heads.
- He relied on the Lord; let Him deliver him, let Him rescue him, if He loves him.
- But they look on and gloat over me; they divide my garments among them, and for my vesture they cast lots.
- Save me from the lion's mouth; from the horns of the wild bulls, my wretched life.
- You who fear the Lord, praise Him: all you descendants of Jacob, give glory to Him.
- There shall be declared to the Lord a generation to come: and the heavens shall show forth His justice.
- To a people that shall be born, which the Lord has made.

Gospel: The Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew (Matt 26:36-75; 27:1-60)

Offertory: Insult has broken my heart, and I am weak; I looked for sympathy, but there was none; for comforters, and I found none. Rather they put gall in My food and in My thirst they gave Me vinegar to drink.

Secret: Grant, we beseech You, almighty God, that the gift offered in the sight of Your majesty may obtain for us the grace of reverent devotion and assure us eternal happiness.

Communion: Father, if this cup cannot pass away, unless I drink it, Your will be done.

Post Communion: By the working of this sacred rite, O Lord, may our sins be erased and our just desires fulfilled.

• Good Friday is a day of Fasting & Abstinence.

Fasting binds Catholics aged 18-58yrs, whereby one may take one (1) full meal in a day and two (2) smaller meals, which when combined equate to less than a second full meal. Abstinence from meat binds Catholics from the age of 14yrs.

• **Good Friday Collection:** Pope Francis has asked that we support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. Your support helps the Church to minister in parishes, provide Catholic schools, offer religious education, and undertake social and charitable works. It is vital that we support Christians living in the Holy Land, to maintain a Christian presence in the very land made holy by the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus. Please be generous.

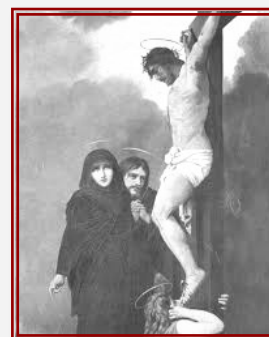
