

St. Thérèse of Lisieux - October 3



"In the year 1895, I received the grace to understand better than ever how much Jesus desires to be loved. Thinking one day of those who offer themselves as victims to the justice of God in order to turn aside the punishment reserved for sinners by taking it upon themselves, I felt this offering to be noble and generous, but I was far from feeling drawn myself to make it. "O my Divine Master," I cried in the depths of my heart, "shall Your justice alone receive victims of holocaust? Has not Your merciful love also need of them? On all sides it is ignored, rejected . . . the hearts on which You would pour it out turn to creatures, seeking happiness in miserable and fleeting affections instead of casting themselves into Your arms, into the ineffable furnace of Your infinite love. "O my God, must Your love remain disdained within Your Heart? It seems to me that if You should find souls offering themselves as victims of holocaust to Your love, You would quickly consume them, that You would be glad not to repress the flames of infinite tenderness pent up within You. . . . "If Your justice — the justice You exercise on earth — be satisfied to discharge itself on voluntary victims, how much the more must Your merciful love desire to enkindle souls, since Your mercy reacheth even to the heavens. "O Jesus, that I may be that happy victim, consume Your holocaust in the fire of Divine Love."

St. Thérèse of Lisieux (+1897) — French Carmelite nun, mystic, and champion of the "Little Way" of holiness, regarded as the greatest saint of modern times."

St. Francis of Assisi - October 4

Consider, O man, how great the excellence in which the Lord has placed you because He has created and formed you to the image of His beloved Son according to the body, and to His own likeness according to the spirit. And all the creatures that are under heaven serve and know and obey their Creator in their own way better than you. And even the demons did not crucify Him, but you together with them crucified Him and still crucify Him by taking delight in vices and sins. Wherefore then can you glory? For if you were so clever and wise that you possessed all science, and if you knew how to interpret every form of language and to investigate heavenly things minutely, you could not glory in all this, because one demon has known more of heavenly things and still knows more of earthly things than all men... In like manner, if you were handsomer and richer than all others, and even if you could work wonders and put the demons to flight, all these things are hurtful to you and in nowise belong to you, and in them you cannot glory; that, however, in which we may glory is in our infirmities, and bearing daily the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ Let us all, brothers, consider the Good Shepherd Who, to save His sheep, bore the suffering of the cross. The sheep of the Lord followed Him in tribulation and persecution and shame, in hunger and thirst, in infirmity and temptations and in all other ways; and for these things they have received everlasting life from the Lord. Wherefore it is a great shame for us, the servants of God, that whereas the Saints have practiced works, we should expect to receive honor and glory for reading and preaching the same.

St. Francis of Assisi (+1226) — Italian mendicant friar, mystic, preacher, and beloved founder of multiple religious Orders.



OCTOBER 2ND, 2022 - EXTERNAL SOLEMNITY OF OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY

INTROIT: Let us all rejoice in the Lord, keeping a feast day in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary, for whose celebration the angels rejoice and unite in praising the Son of God.

COLLECT: O God, Whose only-begotten Son, by His life, death and resurrection, has merited for us the grace of eternal salvation, grant, we beseech You, that, meditating on those mysteries in the most holy rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise. Through the same Jesus Christ, thy Son, Our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with thee in the unity of the Holy Ghost, God, world without end.

EPISTLE: (Prov 8:22-24, 32-35) The Lord begot me, the firstborn of His ways, the forerunner of His prodigies of long ago; from of old I was poured forth, at the first, before the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth. So now, O children, listen to me; happy those who keep my ways. Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not. Happy the man who obeys me, watching daily at my gates, waiting at my doorposts; for he who finds me finds life, and wins favor from the Lord.

GOSPEL: (Luke 1:26-38) At that time, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David, and the virgin's name was Mary. And when the angel had come to her, he said, Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women. When she had heard him she was troubled at his word, and kept pondering what manner of greeting this might be. And the angel said to her, Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found grace with God. Behold, you shall conceive in your womb and shall bring forth a Son; and you shall call His name Jesus. He shall be great, and shall be called the Son of the Most High; and the Lord God will give Him the throne of David His father, and He shall be king over the house of Jacob forever; and of His kingdom there shall be no end. But Mary said to the angel, How shall this happen, since I do not know man? And the angel answered and said to her, The Holy Spirit shall come upon you, and the power of the Most High shall overshadow you; and therefore the Holy One to be born shall be called the Son of God. And behold, Elizabeth your kinswoman also has conceived a son in her old age, and she who was called barren is now in her sixth month; for nothing shall be impossible with God. But Mary said, Behold the handmaid of the Lord; be it done to me according to your word.

OFFERTORY: (Ecclus 24:25; 39:17) In me is all grace of the way and of the truth, in me is all hope of life and of virtue. Like a rose planted near running waters I have borne fruit. Ecclus 24:25; 39:17

SECRET: Grant us, we beseech You, O Lord, to be properly prepared to offer these gifts, and, through the mysteries of the most holy Rosary, so to keep in mind the life, passion and glory of Your only-begotten Son, that we may be made worthy of His promises.

COMMUNION: Break forth in blossoms like the lily, and yield a smell, and bring forth leaves in grace, and praise with canticles, and bless the Lord in His works.

MARY, QUEEN OF THE HOLY ROSARY

O Virgin Mary, grant that the recitation of thy Rosary may be for me each day, in the midst of my manifold duties, a bond of unity in my actions, a tribute of filial piety, a sweet refreshment, an encouragement to walk joyfully along the path of duty. Grant, above all, O Virgin Mary, that the study of thy fifteen mysteries may form in my soul, little by little, a luminous atmosphere, pure, strengthening, and fragrant, which may penetrate my understanding, my will, my heart, my memory, my imagination, my whole being. So shall I acquire the habit of praying while I work, without the aid of formal prayers, by interior acts of admiration and of supplication, or by aspirations of love. I ask this of thee, O Queen of the Holy Rosary, through St Dominic, thy son of predilection, the renowned preacher of thy mysteries, and the faithful imitator of thy virtues. Amen.
