Mothers' prayers for Vocations - Mothers of Lu

Attention all mothers and grandmothers. There has been a tradition in our parish of mothers praying for vocations in their families on the first Sunday of each month and offering their communion and Rosary on that Sunday for that same intention. We will resume doing the prayers of the Mothers of Lu again publicly on the first Sunday of the month after morning Masses. Copies of the prayers and a brief history will be on the tables so all may join in.

- Mothers of Lu Prayer: O God, grant that one of my sons might become a priest. O Lord, grant that one of my children may become a religious. I promise to live as a good Christian woman and will lead my children to all that is good; wherefore I hope to receive the grace to be able to give to Thee, O God, both a holy priest and a religious. Amen
- Prayers for the Church: O Holy Spirit, Creator, mercifully assist Thy Catholic Church, and by Thy heavenly power strengthen and establish Her against the assaults of all Her enemies; and by Thy love and grace, renew the spirit of Thy servants whom Thou hast anointed, that in Thee they may glorify the Father and His onlybegotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Brief History of the Mothers of Lu: The mothers of the village of Lu, Italy (population 1200) prayed together on the first Sunday of each month, and as a result, from their tiny village came 323 vocations to the priesthood and Religious life. Those mothers recited the same prayer above, modified slightly to include Religious vocations as well on the first Sunday of each month and offered their communion and Rosary those days for that intention.

Prayer to Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary

O Virgin Mary, grant that the recitation of thy Rosary may be for me each day, in the midst of my manifold duties, a bond of unity in my actions, a tribute of filial piety, a sweet refreshment, an encouragement to walk joyfully along the path of duty. Grant, above all, O Virgin Mary, that the study of thy fifteen mysteries may form in my soul, little by little, a luminous atmosphere, pure, strengthening, and fragrant, which may penetrate my understanding, my will, my heart, my memory, my imagination, my whole being. So shall I acquire the habit of praying while I work, without the aid of formal prayers, by interior acts of admiration and of supplication, or by aspirations of love. I ask this of thee, O Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, through Saint Dominic, thy son of predilection, the renowned preacher of thy mysteries, and the faithful imitator of thy virtues. Amen.






 Mother's Dav Brunch: We will celebrate Mother's Day with a brunch after the morning Masses on May 12.

For he shall not speak of himself; but what things soever he shall hear, he shall speak; and the things that are to come, he shall shew you. He shall glorify me; because he shall receive of mine, and shall shew it to you.
