St. Margaret Mary Alacoque October 16

Pius the Ninth, in the Apostolic Letters of Beatification of Blessed Margaret Mary, August 19, 1864, says: "Jesus, the Author and Finisher of our Faith, desired nothing more than to kindle the flame of charity by which His Heart was burning in all ways in the hearts of men; but that He might the more kindle this fire of charity, it was His will that the veneration and worship of His Sacred Heart should be instituted and promoted. . . . To Blessed Margaret, fervently praying before the Most August Sacrament of the Eucharist it was made known by Christ our Lord, that it would be most grateful to Him if the worship of His Most Sacred Heart, burning with the fire of charity for mankind, should be instituted."

The Sacred Heart, therefore, which we adore is the human Heart that the Son of God took from the substance of His Immaculate Mother, and in taking deified it. It is the Heart of God, living and life-giving, adored with divine worship in heaven and earth, at the right hand of His Father, and in His real presence in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed Margaret Mary was an unlettered woman, despised and persecuted even in her own convent, thought to be a



visionary, and to be beside herself, without cultivation and without theology. Nevertheless she has left behind her writings and meditations and counsels and records of the visions she received, and instructions to those who were under her charge, full of intuitive perception of divine truth, of subtle discernment in the spiritual life, of ardor and love and a surpassing knowledge of the Sacred Heart. What was the source of all this? An infused light — the light that was shed abroad in the heart by the Holy Ghost.

Henry Cd. Manning (d. 1892) — Prominent convert from Anglicanism, made a Cardinal under Pope Bl. Pius IX.



NINETEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

NTROIT: I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord; in whatever tribulation they shall cry to Me, I will hear them; and I will be their Lord forever. Ps 77:1 Hearken, My people, to My teaching; incline your ears to the words of My mouth.

Collect: Almighty and merciful God, graciously keep away from us all misfortune, that, unhampered in soul L and body, we may perform with peaceful minds the works that are Yours.

PISTLE: (Eph 4:23-28) Brethren: Be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, which has been created according to God in justice and holiness of truth. Wherefore, put away lying and speak truth each one with his neighbor, because we are members of one another. Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down upon your anger; do not give place to the devil. He who was wont to steal, let him steal no longer; but rather let him labor, working with his hands at what is good, that he may have something to share with him who suffers need.

G RADUAL: (Ps 140:2) Let my prayer come like incense before You, O Lord. The lifting up of my hands, like the evening sacrifice. Alleluia, alleluia. Ps 104:1 Give thanks to the Lord, invoke His name; make known among the nations His deeds. Alleluia.

ospel: (Matt 22:1-14) At that time, Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the Pharisees in parables, saying, The Vingdom of heaven is like a king who made a marriage feast for his son. And he sent his servants to call in those invited to the marriage feast, but they would not come. Again he sent out other servants, saying, "Tell those who are invited, behold, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and fatlings are killed, and everything is ready; come to the marriage feast." But they made light of it, and went off, one to his farm, and another to his business; and the rest laid hold of his servants, treated them shamefully, and killed them. But when the king heard of it, he was angry; and he sent his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he said to his servants, "The marriage feast indeed is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy; go therefore to the crossroads, and

invite to the marriage feast whomever you shall find." And his servants went out into the roads, and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; and the marriage feast was filled with guests. Now the king went in to see the guests, and he saw there a man who had not on a wedding garment. And he said to him, "Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?" But he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind his hands and feet and cast him forth into the darkness outside, where there will be the weeping and the gnashing of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.
