




ANNOUNCEMENTS

NOVEMBER 27, 2022 ~ FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

NTROIT: To You I lift up my soul: in You, O my God, I trust; let me not be put to shame; let not my enemies exult over me. No one who waits for You shall be put to shame. Your ways, O Lord, make known to me; teach me Your paths.

OLLECT: Put forth Your power, O Lord, we beseech You, and come, that with Source of our protector we may be rescued from the impending danger of our sins; and with You as our deliverer, may we obtain our salvation.

PISTLE: (Rom 13:11-14)Brethren: Understand, for it is now the hour for us to rise from sleep, because now our salvation is nearer than when we came to believe. The night is far advanced; the day is at hand. Let us therefore lay aside the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light. Let us walk becomingly as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in debauchery and wantonness, not in strife and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

And He spoke to them a parable. Behold the fig tree, and all the trees. When they now put forth their buds, you know that summer is near.
