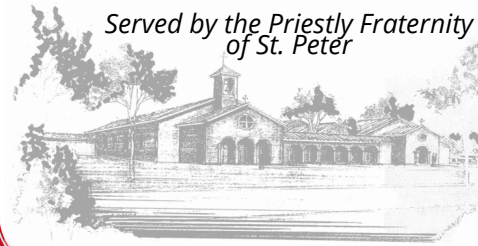

- Upon the Feast of the Epiphany, the Church supplies the faithful with a great gift in the form of a solemn blessing of holy water that is afterwards referred to as Epiphany Water.
